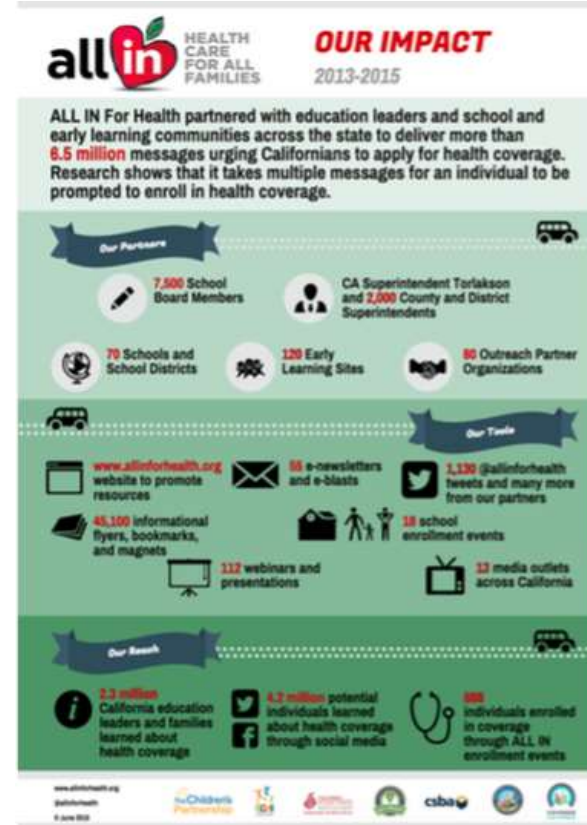

### AUGUST-OCTOBER

#### BACK TO SCHOOL

Beginning this year, schools are required to provide information to families about their health coverage opportunities (K&J 2706). ALL IN For Health has made it easy for schools to do what is needed.

- ▶ Include the ALL IN family flyer in your enrollment packet to help families enroll, get care, and renew their coverage. This will meet the All 2706 requirement.
- ▶ Pass out ALL IN bookmarks at your back-to-school event and place them in your school library, front office, and other places throughout the school.

### NOVEMBER-JANUARY

#### WINTER BREAK

Covered California's open enrollment to health coverage only runs from November 1, 2015 to January 31, 2016. Make sure families know when it is and remind them to enroll before it closes.

- ▶ Contact all families through rebroadcasts in languages most relevant to your community. ALL IN provides draft rebroadcast scripts in English and Spanish.
- ▶ Distribute the Easy Steps to Enroll in Health Coverage infographic at your school's holiday performances or in backpacks before students head home for winter break.
- ▶ Share ALL IN holiday-themed graphics and messages on your school's Facebook and Twitter.

### MARCH-APRIL

#### OPEN HOUSE & SPRING BREAK

Now that families have coverage, we need to encourage them to use it. ALL IN resources help families answer where and where to get care.

- ▶ Pass out the new ALL IN flyer on how families can use their health coverage at your Open House and at other events throughout spring. (Coming Spring 2016)

### MAY

#### SCHOOL YEAR WRAP-UP

Thanks to recent policy changes, income-eligible undocumented children will qualify for Medi-Cal, set to begin no sooner than May 1, 2016. Stay tuned for more details.

- ▶ Send information in your school newsletters. ALL IN will have a template sheet to include.

### JUNE-JULY

#### SUMMER VACATION

Families can have a healthy summer by enrolling in health coverage and using that coverage. Eligible families can enroll in Medi-Cal year-round. Enrollment in Covered California is offered for special qualifying events, such as a move, change of jobs, or turning 26.

- ▶ Share ALL IN summer-themed graphics and messages on your school's Facebook and Twitter.
- ▶ Distribute the ALL IN family flyer at any summer events on campus or at summer sports practices before students get proposals to play.
- ▶ Pass out the ALL IN flyer on how families can use their health coverage.

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## Enroll. Get Care. Renew. Health Coverage All Year Long

### Health Coverage Options

#### Medi-Cal:

- ▶ Children, foster youth, pregnant women, adults, US citizens, and immigrants—including those with DACA status—may be eligible for no- or low-cost Medi-Cal.
- ▶ Medi-Cal covers immunizations, checkups, specialists, vision and dental services, and more for children and youth at no- or low-cost.
- ▶ Medi-Cal enrollment is available year round.

#### Covered California:

- ▶ Covered California is where legal residents of California can compare quality health plans and choose the one that works best for them.
- ▶ Based on income and family size, many Californians may qualify for financial assistance.
- ▶ Enroll during Open Enrollment or any time you experience a life-changing event, like losing your job or having a baby. You have 60 days from the event to complete enrollment.

Immigration status information is kept private, protected, and secure. It will not be used by any immigration agency to enforce immigration laws, but only to determine eligibility for health programs.

- ▶ Medi-Cal must be renewed every year. Medi-Cal will mail renewal packet. Complete and return. For help, contact your local Medi-Cal office or call 211.
- ▶ Health plans through Covered California must be renewed every year. Renewal information will be mailed at the end of the year, or contact Covered California at 1 (800) 300-1506.

## The ABCs of Health Coverage for ALL Kids

### HEALTHY KIDS MAKE BETTER LEARNERS.

Now there is a new opportunity for children, regardless of immigration status, to enroll in health coverage and access the care they need.

### A ALL children, regardless of immigration status, will soon qualify for Medi-Cal coverage

Medi-Cal is free or low-cost health coverage for children and families with limited incomes. Thanks to recent actions, all children and youth younger than 19 whose families meet the income guidelines will soon qualify for the full scope of benefits under Medi-Cal. For example, all children in a family of four that has a monthly income of \$3,575 will qualify for coverage. Coverage for undocumented children will begin no sooner than May 2016.

### B Begin enrolling your kids now

Medi-Cal enrollment is available year-round. Even though enrollment in full-scope Medi-Cal for undocumented children will start May of this year, families can take action now by enrolling into restricted Medi-Cal (also known as emergency Medi-Cal) TODAY! If your child is enrolled in restricted Medi-Cal, he or she will be automatically enrolled in full-scope Medi-Cal when the expanded program begins. You can apply in person at your local county human services office, over the phone, with a mail-in application, or at your local clinic. You can get help finding a clinic at [www.allinforhealth.org](http://www.allinforhealth.org) or by calling 888.899.7587.

### C Coverage is free or low cost

Medi-Cal is free for families who meet income requirements. Other families, depending on their income, may have a small monthly premium. Coverage opens the door to free preventive care and free or low-cost treatment, including medical, vision, dental, and mental health services.

### D Don't forget to bring what you need

When you apply for Medi-Cal, bring as many of the following items as you can:

- **Proof of Identity** (driver's license or photo ID)
- **Proof of Income** (current pay stub or bank statement)
- **Child's Birth Certificate** (regardless of the country of origin)
- **Proof of Residency** (telephone or electric bill)
- **Medi-Cal cards of other family members**, if applicable

Not all items are required for enrollment.

### IMMIGRANT FAMILIES

may fear sharing information related to their immigration status. It is important to remember that your immigration status information is kept private, protected, and secure. Medi-Cal application information will not be shared with any immigration agency to enforce immigration laws and will only be used to determine eligibility for health programs.

## Are You DACAmented?

**People with DACA Status Are Eligible for Health Coverage**

**What is DACA?**  
 Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA)\* gives protection from deportation and work permits to some undocumented immigrant youth who came to the US before their 16th birthday, have lived in the US since June 15, 2007, and meet other requirements. You must be at least 15 years old to apply, unless you are in Immigration Court or have a deportation order. Applicants are encouraged to apply as soon as possible.

**If you have DACA status, you may also qualify for Medi-Cal health coverage.** Based on income, you may qualify for preventive and other essential health care services at low or no cost.

**It is safe to apply for Medi-Cal even if your family members do not have legal status.** Medi-Cal keeps your information private and secure. **Some of the health services available through Medi-Cal:**

- Doctor visits and prescription drugs
- Emergency services
- Hospitalization
- Family planning, maternity, and newborn care
- Mental health and substance use disorder services, including behavioral health treatment
- Physical and occupational therapy and needed medical devices
- Laboratory services
- Preventive and wellness services, including immunizations
- Chronic disease management
- Dental and vision care

**How do I apply for and renew Medi-Cal?**

- Call 1 (800) 300-1596, or 211 to find your local Medi-Cal office.

Every year Medi-Cal will send a renewal packet. Complete and return. For help, contact your local Medi-Cal county office (listed on the renewal packet).

\* On November 20, 2014, President Obama expanded DACA and created DAPA (Deferred Action for Parents of Americans and Lawful Permanent Residents) to include more people. However, the US government is not accepting applications for expanded DACA and DAPA status yet. They are waiting for a court decision.

## Four Easy Steps to Get Health Care for Your Family



### Choose Providers That Are Right for Your Family

You need a doctor, dentist, and other providers that you can trust and build a relationship with as your child grows. Visit your health insurance plan website to find a list of providers or call your plan for help in finding a provider. When calling to make an appointment, ask the provider questions that are important to you, such as whether the provider speaks your family's language or if the provider treats your child's unique health conditions. If you're assigned a provider and want to change, contact your plan.



### Make Appointments for No-Cost Annual Health and Dental Care Checkups

Schedule an annual well-child visit with your child's doctor to check your child's growth and development, get their recommended shots, and receive other health screenings. With a primary care doctor, you can manage your child's chronic conditions, like asthma or diabetes. Instead of going to the emergency room, and primary care doctors can help you locate other trusted medical care where you need it. And every six months, take your child for a no-cost dental checkup.



### Get Help When Your Child Needs It

Life doesn't always go as planned. Your family can use your insurance card to get care for things like strep throat, scratches, allergies, injuries on the playground, or mental health care. In an emergency, your insurance card can help get you and your family care when you need it most.



### Keep Your Child's Health Records Handy

Be sure to keep all of your child's health information in one place. You will need it to show immunization records and other health information at the beginning of the school year or before your child begins to play a school sport.

## HEALTH 101 PREVENTIVE CARE

With a health insurance card in hand, you don't need to be sick to get care. Key screenings and checkups support the healthy development of your child. These aren't just conditions before they become a problem. And many preventive services are available at no cost to your family, including well-child visits, physicals, hearing and vision screenings, immunizations, mental health screenings, and dental checkups.

- **AB 2706 (Hernandez)**—New law requiring schools to provide health coverage information in their enrollment packets for schools years 2015-2018
- Collaborated with CDE and Covered California to develop ALL IN Family Flyer for schools to comply with AB 2706

**WHAT:** California Assembly Bill 2706 (Hernandez) requires schools to provide health coverage information in their enrollment packets at the beginning of the school year.

**WHY:** This bill takes advantage of the role schools can play in connecting children and families to health coverage and has the goal of increasing the number of uninsured children and families who enroll in health coverage.

**WHEN:** Beginning in the 2015 school year through 2018, public schools will be required to provide information to families about their health coverage opportunities and enrollment assistance.

**HOW:** To fulfill the requirements of the bill schools can do one of the following -

- ▶ Send **ALL IN Family Flyer\*** home with children in their backpacks. Download the Family Flyer at [www.allinforhealth.org/ab\\_2706](http://www.allinforhealth.org/ab_2706).
- ▶ Develop your own informational item explaining basic information about affordable health care coverage options for children and families.
- ▶ Amend an existing enrollment form with up-to-date health coverage information.

## AB 2308 (Hernandez)



- Would establish the California Health Care Coverage Enrollment Assistance Act of 2016 to provide uninsured students of the California State University and the California Community Colleges with information about health care coverage options and enrollment assistance commencing with the 2017–18 academic year. Additionally, it would repeal the end date for AB 2706 (2014) provisions and extend these requirements indefinitely.



## Great News For Undocumented Children & Youth



- SB 75
- All income-eligible children, regardless of immigration status, will qualify for Medi-Cal no sooner than May 1, 2016

## SB 10 (Lara)



- This bill would require the Secretary of California Health and Human Services to apply to the United States Department of Health and Human Services for a waiver to allow individuals who are not eligible to obtain health coverage because of their immigration status to obtain coverage from the Exchange. The bill would require, after that waiver has been granted, the Exchange to offer California qualified health benefit plans, as specified, to these individuals. The bill would require that individuals eligible to purchase California qualified health plans pay the cost of coverage without federal assistance.
