About CSHC

The California School Health Centers Association (CSHC) is seeking prospective board candidates interested in leveraging their experience and connections to help strengthen our organization and cultivate support for our mission. CSHC improves the health and academic success of children and youth by advancing health services in schools.

We hired our first paid staff in 2003. Today we have 12 staff and a budget of around \$1.6 million. We are governed by a volunteer board of directors from throughout the state who bring a broad range of health, education, policy and corporate backgrounds to the table. Our board terms are two years with a maximum of four consecutive terms. We are currently seeking board members with mental health program experience.

Board Member Responsibilities

- Participate in four board meetings annually. (Three are in-person, and one is by phone). Each meeting requires a few hours of preparation to review reports and background materials. CSHC will reimburse members for travel expenses.
- 2. Be accessible for personal contact in between board meetings.
- 3. Provide leadership to board committees. Each board director is expected to serve as an active, ongoing member of at least one committee (Resource Development, Board Development, and Policy). This requires monthly conference calls plus time for individual committee tasks. In addition to these committee assignments, interested board members are also invited to serve on other ad hoc committees.
- 4. Commit time to developing financial resources for CSHC. This includes making a personally meaningful financial gift, joining as an individual or organization and supporting other fund development activities.
- 5. Utilize personal and professional skills, relationships and knowledge for the advancement of CSHC.
