Policy Updates

Under our new strategic plan, we will be focusing our state policy toward advocating for health care financing for the key elements of the school-based health model that are not currently reimbursed. We are working to ensure that SBHCs are included in the innovative payment models focusing on prevention and improving the quality of care while reducing costs. To help us think about this we will be looking to the SBHC field for feedback on these policy considerations. For example:

- How are SBHCs using community health workers, promotoras, and/or health educators?
- What types of "preventive services" are SBHCs doing (beyond 1:1 patient screenings)?
- How are they billing for or funding these services?
