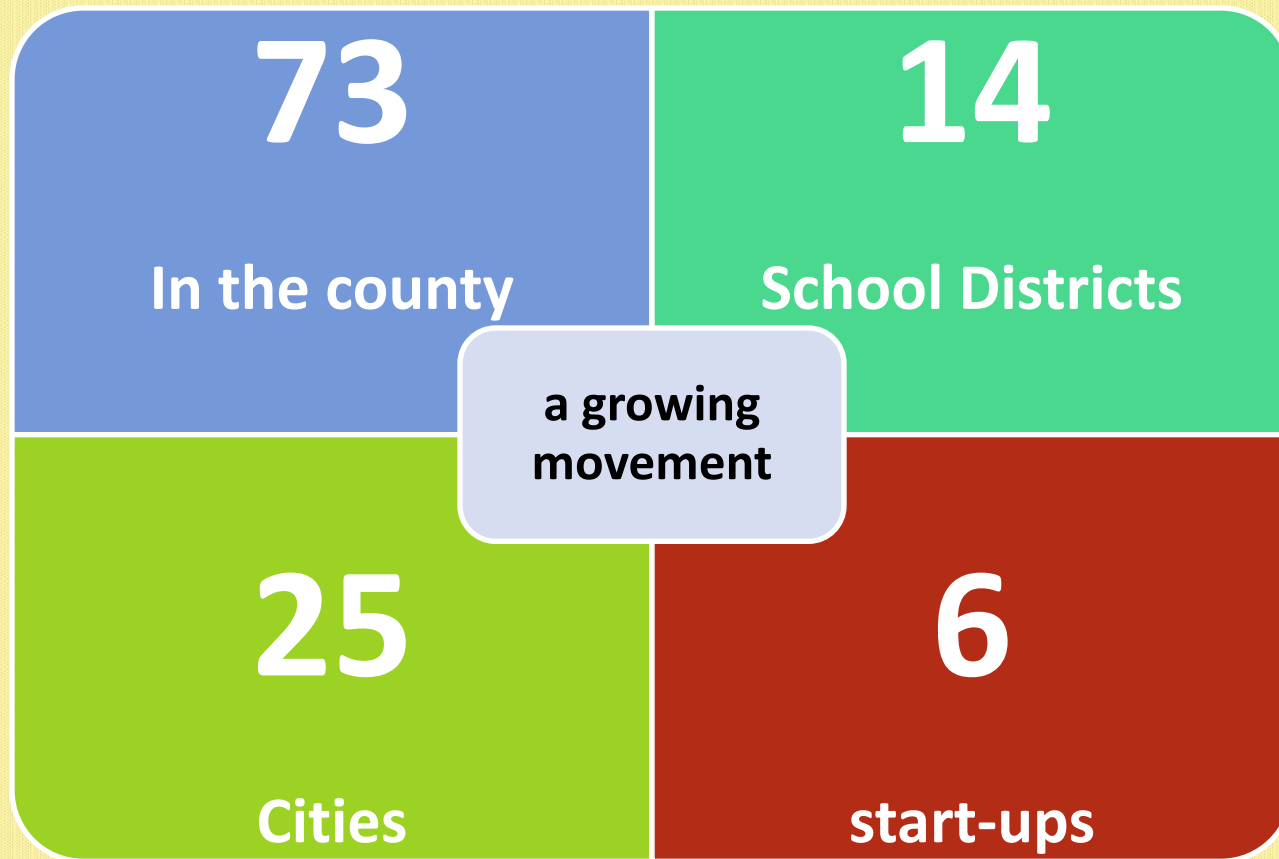

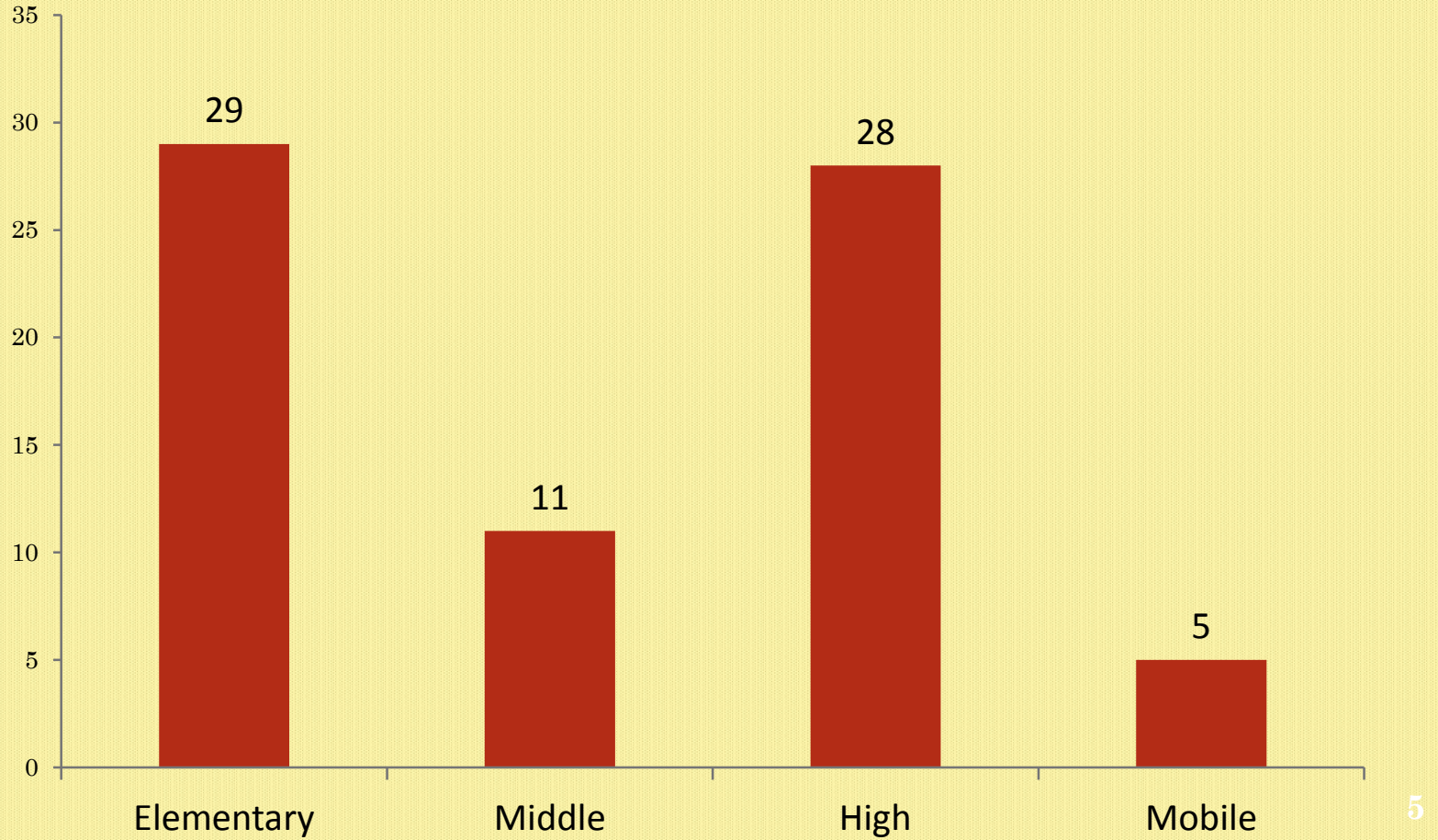

# WELLNESS NETWORK 5-7 YEAR GOALS

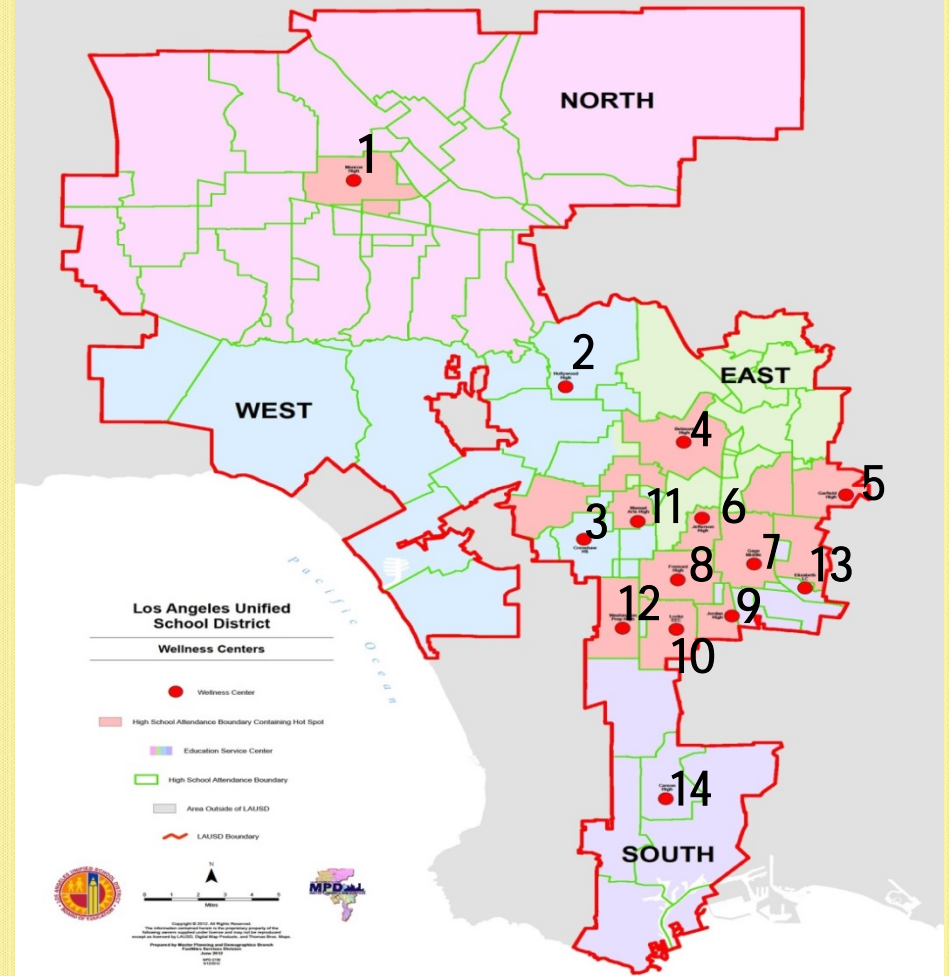
- Wellness Centers are expanded, maximized and include the network of schools

  - Improved asthma management



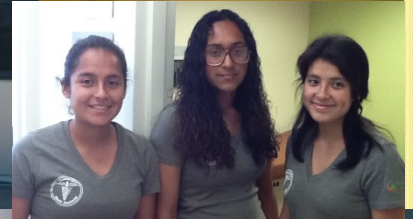

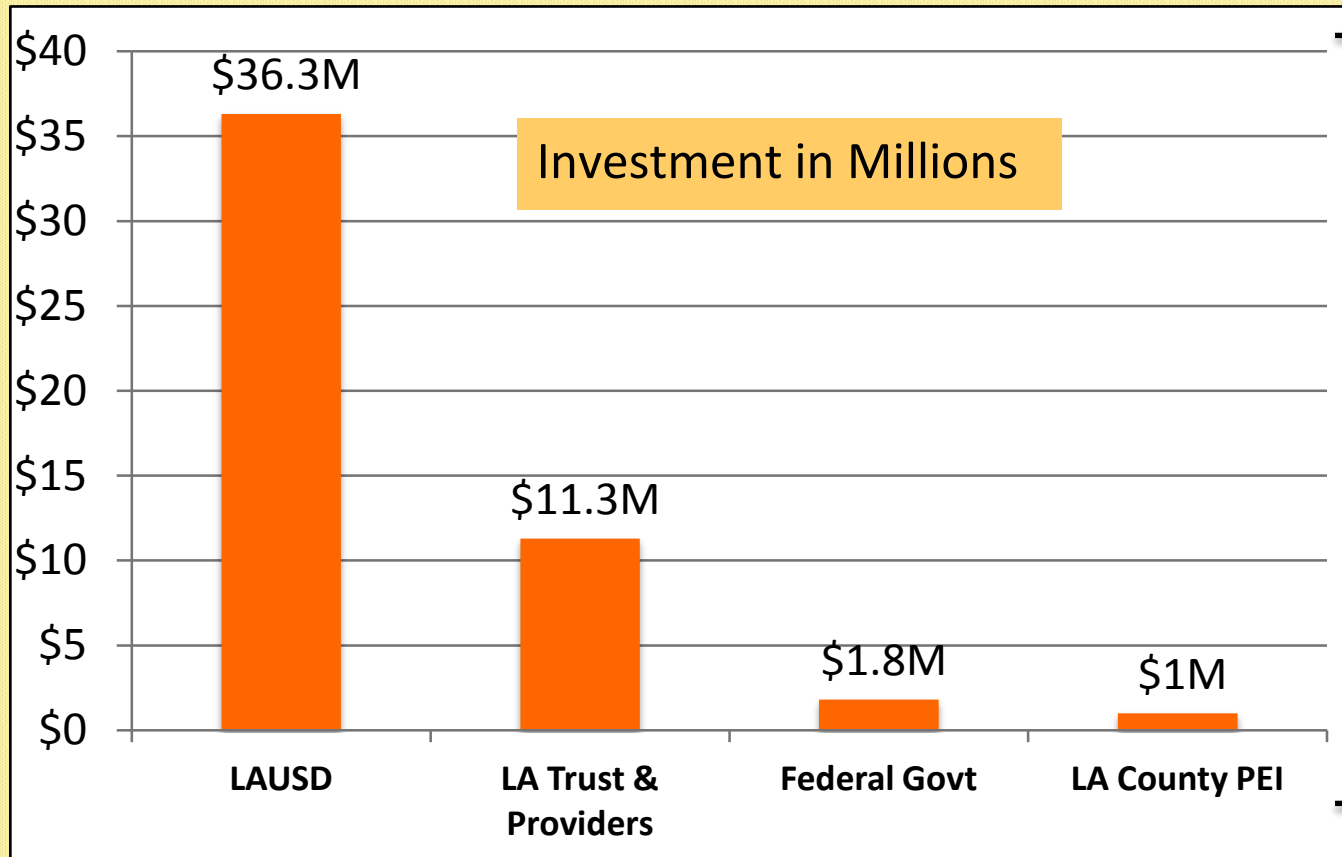
