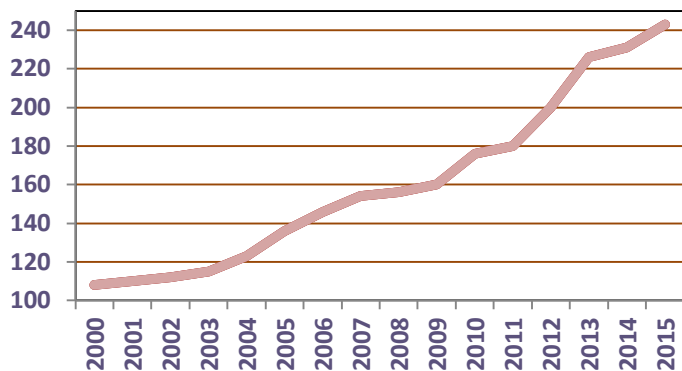


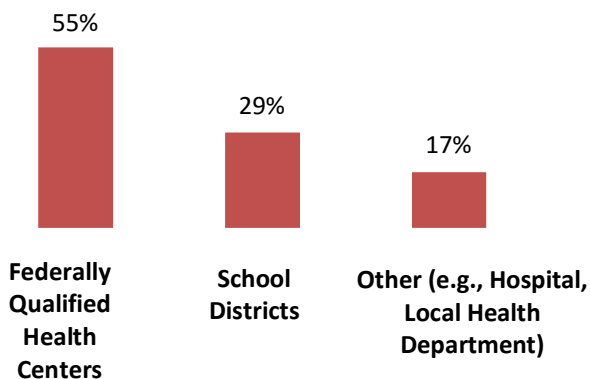
School-Based Health Centers in California: A Growing Trend

In 2000, there were 108 school-based health centers (SBHCs); today, there are 243. As a result, over 257,000 students now have access to a health center at their school.

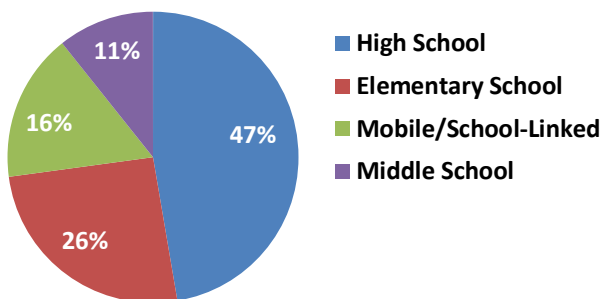
SBHC Growth



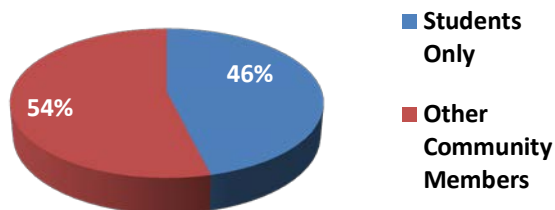

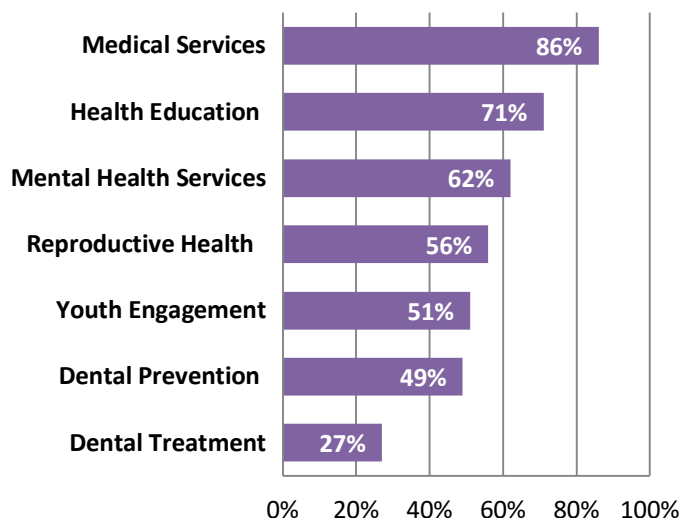
School Levels Served

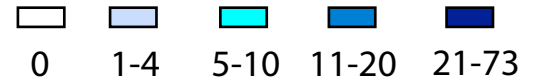
Sources of Revenue

- **Reimbursement** through the Child Health and Disability Prevention Program (CHDP), Family PACT, Medi-Cal, health insurance, and EPSDT contracts for mental health services.
- **School district contributions** or in-kind support of space, utilities, and custodial services.
- **Sponsoring agency contributions** or subsidies.
- **Government and private grants.**
