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

CSHA's 2021 Policy Priorities



Advocate for federal and state funding for schoolbased health centers (SBHCs).

Center SBHCs in post-COVID school reopening guidelines and efforts.



Advocate for improved substance use prevention and early intervention in schools through investment from Prop 64 and decreased punitive discipline policies.



Support increased coordination between state departments (CDPH, CDE, and DHCS) to support school-based health services.



Advocate for health care financing reforms that make school health services more accessible and/or SBHCs more sustainable.

California State Budget

- Passed in June
- Trailer Bills passed in June & July

Other state legislation

 Last days to pass bills from the Legislature: Sept 10

Federal Budget and Legislation



CA State Budget

Main takeaways:

- ✓ No specific funding for SBHCs but...
- Unprecedented funding in school based health and student support services
- ✓ Main budget bill passed and signed in June → trailer bills passed in late June, early July

Child & Youth Behavioral Health Initiative

** \$4 billion **

- Medi-Cal Managed Care Incentive Program
- School-linked Behavioral Health Partnerships & Capacity competitive grants
- Mental Health Student Services Act Grant Program

Also...

- A virtual platform
- Behavioral health workforce initiatives, including BH counselors & coaches
- Behavioral health infrastructure

CYBHI: Opportunities for SBHCs

<u>School-Based Health Centers: Central to Addressing</u> <u>Child & Youth Behavioral Health in Schools</u>

- Students use SBHCs for BH services
- SBHCs provide integrated physical and behavioral health
- SBHCs leverage Medi-Cal providers and coordinate care
- SBHCs are effective at providing prevention and early intervention services
- SBHCs increase equitable access to care



CDE: Funding for Student Health

Community Schools: \$2.8 billion

 Integrated support services (including health!) + family and student engagement + collaborative practices + extended learning

School Health Demonstration Project: \$5 million

To support up to 25 LEAs in leveraging Medi-Cal funding to support school health services

Office of School-Based Health: \$700,000/year



School Health Demonstration Project Most SBHCs leverage existing Medi-Cal providers



CSHA Sponsored Bills

AB 563 (Berman): Office of School-Based Health at CDE



Included in State Budget Officially a "two-year" bill

SB 316 (Eggman): Same-Day Billing for FQHCs

- Heard in Assembly Appropriations TODAY
- Lots of support in Legislature
- Opposition from DHCS

Other Legislation to Note

- AB 32 (Aguiar-Curry): Telehealth
- AB 285 (Holden): State school nurse consul
- AB 586 (O'Donnell): School Health Demons
- AB 1117 (Wicks): Healthy Start

Incorporated into budget trailer bills

AB 1038 (Gipson): CA Health Equity Program


Federal Policy

2nd COVID relief package (December 2020)

- \$5 million for FQHCsponsored SBHCs
- SBHC Reauthorization Act

Federal Appropriations (Right Now)

- \$50 million for SBHCs included in House package
- \$200 million expected from Senate
