
Nicotine Salt Vaping

Teens Find a Big Loophole in the New Flavored Vaping Ban

The policy allows mint, dessert and fruit flavors to continue to be sold in disposable e-cigarettes, prompting many teens to switch from Juul to those devices.

High vaping rates among youth and young adults have introduced a plethora of new terms and keeping up with the latest lingo can be difficult. If you are wondering what the young people in your life are talking about, here is a list of some popular words, phrases, products and general language used to refer to vaping/e-cigarette use.

A type of device that uses disposable pods containing e-liquid (typically ~200-500 puffs). The body of these devices can be recharged and the disposable pods can be replaced with new compatible pods.















OPEN/REFILLABLE SYSTEM, REFILLABLE DEVICES

These systems require vape juice and come in three varieties: box mods, pens and refillable pods. These devices have tanks or pods that are continuously refilled with vape juice and the pods/ tanks are not thrown away after one use. These systems are used more by "hobbyist" vapers because they require more upkeep and are typically modified to be able to do tricks.

DISPOSABLES

Devices that are not refillable and are intended for one-time use. These typically have ~200 puffs and some examples include Puff Bars, Stig. Pop, Posh, Hyde and Cuvie (HQD).





50+ mg/mL nicotine

12% THC


Cannabis concentrates:

80%+ THC

While only 8% of 11th grade students in Orange County report vaping in the past month, more than a third of these students report vaping daily (3% overall)

Nicotine and THC can affect **learning, attention, and memory.**

Both are especially addictive in teen brains and when used during times of **stress**.
