 The Hi-Desert Memorial Health Care District has a 60 year history. It was <u>envisioned</u> & <u>built</u> by the <u>community</u> to serve as a *healthcare safety-net* in the Morongo Basin.

Timeline Highlights

- 1962: Formed initially by the State of CA
- 1975: Hi-Desert Memorial Hospital opened
- 2015: District's hospital operations was sold to <u>Tenet Healthcare Corp</u> 30 yr. lease
 - DBA Morongo Basin Healthcare District (MBHD)
 - Focus on <u>broader scope through our community clinics</u> to improve the health and wellness of the community we serve.
- 2016: Federally Qualified Health Center status

About Us

Our Mission: is to improve the health and wellness of the residents who live in the District's geographic boundaries.

Healthcare Services: which provide primary (adult & peds) and specialty healthcare, behavioral health, dental and chiropractic services.

Adjunct Services: <u>LIFT</u> Transportation with free, non-emergency trips to medical appointments. (Grants: <u>MBTA</u>, <u>CalTrans</u>)

Health Education: Designed to *improve lifestyle choices*, leading to healthier eating *and* better <u>disease management</u> through <u>preventative</u> health <u>screenings</u> and <u>early</u> <u>detection</u> of disease.


Dental Transformative Initiative <u>Virtual Dental Home</u>(VDH) Local Dental Pilot Project (LDPP-IE) 2018-2020

Created by the Pacific Center for Special Care at the University of the Pacific School of Dentistry (UOP) and currently supported by Dr. Paul Glassman and his team at California Northstate University (CNU), the VDH is an evidence-based strategy for addressing barriers to accessing dental care by bringing that care to patients where they are—such as at schools, early learning sites, and other sites in the community.

LDPP-IE VDH Partners






First MUSD dental patients - January 2019 Mobile Medical Unit (Medical & Dental Services)














Dentist off site "store forward" asynchronous (A) Records review (B) Treatment planning (C) Community vs. Clinic Decision




They are also less likely to have health insurance or access to health and mental health services that address these risk factors. Without such services, childhood risk factors are more likely to be translated into higher rates of diabetes, heart disease, cancer, and other chronic illnesses in adulthood as well as more struggles with academic success.

- Of California's 293 school health centers, 39% are in high schools, 21% are in elementary schools, 10% are in middle schools, and 25% are "school linked" or mobile medical vans.
- Many SBHCs are located in schools serving some of the state's most vulnerable children. On campuses with SBHCs, about 70% of students receive free or reduced price meals.

Most of California's SBHCs are physically located right on campus within a main building or in a portable. In some areas, health services are provided by mobile medical or dental vans, and in other areas, "school-linked" health centers are off campus and have formal operating agreements with schools.
